Key with answers

In five years' time there will be no houses in this street. (demolish)
In five years' time they will have demolished all the houses in this street.

The Christmas tree will be ready before our children come back. (decorate)
We will have decorated the Christmas tree before our children come back.

This is my tenth year of teaching experience. (teach)
I will have been teaching for ten years this year.

I am going to finish my second book by the end of this year. (publish)
My second book will have been published by the end of this year.

Greg will call me and I must think about his proposal before that. (consider)
Before Greg calls me, I will have been considering his proposal all the time.

You will be hot until you open the window. (sweat)
You will have been sweating until you open the window.

On Thursday we will have all the needed information. (receive)
By Friday we will have received all the needed information.

We planted the trees nearly three years ago. (grow)
This year the trees will have been growing for three years.

We will be in Paris sooner than at 5 p. m. (arrive)
We will have arrived in Paris by 5 p. m.

Our English workshop will start at 8 o'clock and it will finish at 12 o'clock. (work)
At noon we we will have been working on our English project for four hours.
