Exercise 5

Respond to the following situations. Use possessive adjectives (my, your, his, our...) with gerunds.

Example:

He appreciated there.

'I don't know why they get up so early at weekends,' he wondered.

He didn't understand so early at weekends.

'We can't make private calls on this phone,' he told me.

He objected to private calls on that phone.

'Don't laugh at me,' she said.

She was angry with at her.

'They arrive late to class,' he argued.

He resented late to class.
