James heard a dog on the road. He <u>did not (didn't) hear</u> a dog on the rode. He saw it.

James ran over the dog. He <u>did not (didn't) run</u> over the dog. He stopped his car.

The dog was barking at James all the time. The dog was not (wasn't) barking at James all the time. It barked at him only once.

James talked to the dog. He <u>did not (didn't) talk</u> to the dog. He shouted at him.

James threw a stone at the dog. He <u>did not (didn't) throw</u> a stone at the dog. He followed it.

The dog bit James. The dog <u>did not (didn't) bite</u> James. It took him to the girls.

The girls were sitting on the grass. They were not (weren't) sitting on the grass. They were lying on it.

The girls were sleeping. They were not (weren't) sleeping. They were bleeding.
